

MSA ENGLISH RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP – 2007

BTRDA Ltd are pleased to confirm that they will again be promoting the MSA English Rally Championship. The Championship will be open to drivers holding a minimum of a Stage Nat B Competition Licence.

EVENTS

The Championship is based on seven 'English' based forest stage rallies with a good geographical and date spread.

SCORING

Best five scores to count to final Championship and class point's total.

ELIGIBILITY

Vehicles must fit into one of the five Championship classes.

- Class E1 Up to and including 1400cc
- Class E2 Over 1400cc up to and including 1600cc
- Class E3 Over 1600cc up to and including 2000cc
- Class E4 Over 2000cc two wheel drive
- Class E5 Over 2000cc four wheel drive conforming to FIA Group N and vehicles that have previously been homologated in Group N4 and still comply with their homologation papers.

The engine capacities stated are after multiplying the actual capacity by the forced induction equivalency factor of 1.7. This does not apply to Diesel engines.

CLASS BASED scoring system for the overall MSA English Rally Championship

The scoring will reflect achievement against other registered competitors in the same capacity class and the level of championship competition in that class.

Points will be allocated as follows: -

1st in class = 20 points, 2nd in class = 18 points, 3rd in class = 17 points...etc down to two points for the 18th placed driver / co-driver and every subsequent driver / co-driver that finishes the event. One point will be awarded to every non finisher.

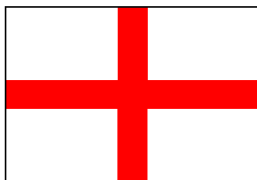
In addition one point will be awarded for each English Rally Championship contender beaten in the class up to a maximum of 5 points.

Example....

If Class E1 has 8 registered crews and Class E4 has 4 registered crews.

The winner of Class E1 would score 20 + 5 = 25

The winner of Class E4 would score 20 + 3 = 23
