EVENTSIGNS WOODPECKER STAGES

JORDAN ROAD SURFACING BTRDA GOLD STAR® CHAMPIONSHIP

BRACE YOURSELVES - GEORGE HASN'T FINISHED YET!...

Having secured his second consecutive Jordan Road Surfacing BTRDA Silver Star® Championship crown on the Nicky Grist Stages in July, George Lepley's efforts had also put him into a possible podium finish in the Gold Star® Series as well. OK - Euan Thorburn/Paul Beaton are the undisputed champions, but 2nd & 3rd are still to be decided. So...

The penultimate round of the Jordan Road Surfacing BTRDA Rally Series was the Ludlow Racecourse-based Woodpecker Stages. The organisers had received a phenomenal entry of over 150 cars, among which was one from a certain G. Lepley in a B13 Mitsubishi Lancer EVOX. Seeded at No.15, one might have been forgiven for thinking that, in his first competitive outing in a 4WD car, George might take some time to settle in. Wrong!....

The Newark driver, with Tom Woodburn being treated to the fastest ride he's had for a while, was 4th after the opening stage with, in BTRDA terms, just the two Fiestas of Stephen Petch/Michael Wilkinson and Sam Bilham/Patrick Walsh ahead of him. SS2 saw Lepley stop the clock a second quicker than Petch, while Bilham was out of the running after tipping his car over. Equal fastest times on the next two stages put Lepley into top BTRDA spot, with an outright FTD on the final stage just to ram the point home!

It's ironic but, with dropped scores coming into play, Lepley actually ended the day further down the Gold Star table than when he started but, if he can produce a similar performance on the final round, runner-up spot is still within his grasp. Not to put too fine a point

on it, however, he won't be the only one focussing on that!...

Petch/Wilkinson continued their fight back and, with two DNFs, unlike everyone ahead of them in the points who can only improve on their previous scores, they will be able to add all they can muster on the Trackrod. Pressure? Absolutely!...

Ian Bainbridge's debut on a BTRDA round in a Skoda Fabia R5 can be deemed a success - 4th overall and 3rd place points giving the Darlington driver his first finish since the Cambrian in February. The Production Cup twins, Naylor/Lawrence and Thompson/Murphy, occupied the next two places in the results just a handful of seconds apart, with Ian Joel/Graeme Wood (Escort Cosworth) having to settle for 2nd in B13 behind the flying Lepley.

Having missed the last two BTRDA rounds, 2016 Gold Star Champions Charlie Payne/Carl Williamson (Fiesta) had, by their standards, a subdued day to finish just inside the Top Ten, with Richard Hill/Steffan Evans (Impreza) closing it out.

Class B13 now sees a tie for the lead between Richards Hill & Sykes, the latter failing to finish the Woodpecker after his Lancer succumbed to electrical gremlins on the final stage. Just who is to become the 2019 class winner will require sorting out on the Trackrod Forest Stages at the end of the month.

BTRDA PRODUCTION CUP

NAYLOR DIGS IN!...

JCB-sponsored Pat Naylor/Ian Lawrence won the battle of the Group N Lancers on the Woodpecker and, now with the same number of maximum scores as Scott Faulkner/Gareth Parry, lead the BTRDA Production Cup[®] by a single point. So, cue the North York Moors for some high-speed action as this one is brought to a conclusion - no doubt, very quickly!

Defending champions Russ Thompson/Andy Murphy's fourth runners-up spot of the season - although still highly commendable - leaves the top two just out of reach, no matter what they can come up with on the Trackrod.

Having claimed top MRF Fiesta ST Trophy points on each of the first four rounds, Zak Hughes/Tom Wood needed just one more good score to clinch it. A rare retirement on the Nicky Grist meant that they had to wait several weeks for their next opportunity, but it all came good on the Woodpecker - a fifth win, combined with nearest rival Bobby Mitchell's absence from Ludlow, putting the matter beyond doubt.

ANDY CAPS ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL OUTING!....

Just to prove - if proof were necessary - that their maximum Jordan Road Surfacing Silver Star[®] Championship score on the Nicky Grist Stages wasn't a flash in the pan, Andy Davison/Tom Murphy produced a repeat performance in their Talbot Sunbeam VXR on the Woodpecker. BTRDA Rallye R2 Cup contenders Tommi Meadows and James Giddings/ Rhys Stoneman took the next two places in their Fiestas, with the Escort of Rob Wright/Terry Mallin right behind them in 4th.

In the R2 Cup itself, Meadows gained his second consecutive maximum, from Giddings, while Mat & Tim Tordoff achieved their best result of the season so far with a 3rd. Having already clinched the title on the Nicky Grist, in spite of a panel-bending off at the Flying Finish of the final stage, Perry Gardener/Keaton Williams started the Woodpecker Stages but were to be sidelined by gear linkage problems. Let's hope these character-building experiences will set them up for a good run on their Wales Rally GB prize-drive!

Having not furthered his cause in the BTRDA Historic Cup[®] since the Malcolm Wilson Rally, David Gathercole returned to his class-winning ways in his Escort RS1600, while Philip Clarke/Ian Jones (Escort MkII) also

headed home with maximum points scores.

FUCHS LUBRICANTS BTRDA 1400 CHAMPIONSHIP

BLACK IS THE NEW BRONZE!...

Following a decision earlier in the year to award Bronze Stars to the winners of the Fuchs Lubricants BTRDA 1400 Championship, Callum Black/Michael Gilbey confirmed on the Woodpecker that they are to be the first recipients. Another maximum points score - their fourth of the season - put their MG ZR into an unassailable position in the table with one event still to go.

Steve Black/Paul Morris (Suzuki Swift) continued their run of excellent finishes with another 2nd place but erstwhile Championship leaders Chris Powell/Jim Lewis recorded their first DNF of the season when their Talbot Sunbeam went out with mechanical trouble on SS3. However, due to the extremely high level of reliability of all the top 1400 cars this season, Powell/Lewis are safe in runners-up spot, as are Black/Morris in 3rd.

Noel Lappin/Will Atkins took 3rd place points on the Woodpecker in their Escort while Dominic Hodge/Stefan Arndt, who had moved back to Class 1400C in their Micra, were next.

Joseph Keen's attempt to claim the BTRDA Rally First[®] Championship title on the Woodpecker fell victim to a dose of over-enthusiasm when his MG ZR rolled out of the event on the second stage. Graham Roberts' 2.0 litre version scored maximum points which now puts him within touching distance of the leader! Do the trees (on the North York Moors) have ears? If so, there'll be some interesting conversations to listen to on 28th September...

'TCS AT 40' JUNIORS

NOW, DON'T SPEND IT ALL AT ONCE!....

The 'TCS at 40' Junior Driver & Co-driver awards continue to benefit various BTRDA Rally Series contenders who had not yet reached the age of 25 at the start of the season. As might be expected, the name 'Lepley' appears regularly on the list and on the Woodpecker, Zak Hughes, Tommi Meadows, Tom Murphy, Abi Haycock and Gareth Parry also all left Ludlow in a better pecuniary state than when they arrived!...

Martin Little's bank balance continues to be adjusted - downwards! - as each BTRDA Rally Series event passes and, once again, we very much appreciate the gesture - no, not that sort!...

MAXXIS MSA ENGLISH RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP

FIVE DOWN, TWO TO GO!...

Returning to the forests after a brief sojourn on asphalt, courtesy of the Otterburn-based Tyneside Stages Rally at the beginning of August, the MAXXIS Motorsport UK English Rally Championship continued on the Woodpecker Stages.... and it'll come as no surprise to learn that the name of George Lepley remains at the top of the table! A couple of points adrift we find Callum Black who, in turn, has Andy Davison breathing down his neck.

Tommi Meadows also scored maximum points in his class on the Woodpecker but, having retired from the last English Championship round he contested (the Plains Rally), still has some catching up to do.

Pretenders to the English Championship crown have two more events - the Trackrod Forest Stages followed by the Wydean Stages in early November - on which



to assert themselves as they strive to succeed 2018 winners Ian Joel/Graeme Wood in adding a Motorsport UK-backed Championship title to their rallying CVs.

The 2020 calendar includes a great selection of **one-day forest events**, starting with the Cambrian Rally in North Wales in February and finishing with the Trackrod Forest Stages at the end of September. New for 2020 will be the 75th running of the Scottish Rally, based at Lockerbie just off the M74. The final points table will be based on a competitor's best 5 scores, which provides some flexibility to fit around family or business commitments.

DECALS: Competitors are reminded that **they must display the 2019 BTRDA Rally Series decals** on every qualifying event to be eligible to score points in the JORDAN Road Surfacing BTRDA Rally Series and the MAXXIS Motorsport UK 2019 English Rally Championship. These include a sponsor panel on each side of the car and a championship screen strip which must be displayed on the windscreen, not on the roof. Decals are available from the BTRDA desk at event signing on. NB: Not carrying a screen strip will also exclude the car from any film coverage. Co-drivers with non-registered drivers must carry 2 x BTRDA club decals on the car.

ON EVENT FUEL: **Vital Equipment are the recommended fuel supplier** for the BTRDA Rally Series and will be providing a re-fuel service at all the events.
